- Improve teacher capability to deliver highly differentiated literacy lessons coaching, feedback and professional development to improve student outcomes in reading and literacy

Our initiatives include

- Embedding the Windera State School Reading Framework to ensure consistency of practice and common language is used across the school with all staff
- Developing staff knowledge of synthetic phonics to effectively embed in daily practice
- Providing Professional Development opportunities for all staff to confidently embed learning walls in their classrooms
- Embedding quality case management approaches to improve individual student results
- Providing scheduled coaching and feedback opportunities for staff improvement and development
- Developing and delivering targeted intervention using targeted, focused and intensive supports for students reading below benchmark
